

## Potluck Wool Mittenettes <br> Potluck Wool Mittenette

size: average adult woman's hand
yarn: Cherry Tree Hill
Potluck Worsted
(OR any worsted weight yarn)
needles: US 7 double pointed
gauge: 5 sts per inch on US 7

## abbreviations

st(s) $=$ stitch(es)
sl st = slip stitch
$\mathrm{k}=\mathrm{knit}$
p = purl
beg $=$ beginning
$\mathrm{m} 1=$ insert left needle in top of loop of stitch that is just below next stitch, knit loop (or pick up stitch with right needle and place it onto left needle)

## INSTRUCTIONS

- Using US 7 double pointed needles, cast on 30 sts and divide evenly between 3 needles ( 10 sts each needle), mark beginning of round (NOTE: you can use US 5 needles for the ribbing if you prefer a tight cuff)
- work k1, p1 ribbing for 12 rounds
- k 8 rounds
- $k$ across next needle
- k across next needle, now move the marker from the beg of the round to the end of this needle. You will now call the next group of sts "needle 1"

INCREASE ROUNDS
work each needle as follows:

## round one

needle 1 - k to 2 sts from end, m1, k2
needle $2-\mathrm{k} 1, \mathrm{~m} 1, \mathrm{k}$ to end
needle 3 - $k$ across
round two (and ALL even rounds)
needle 1 - k across
needle $2-\mathrm{k}$ across
needle 3 - $k$ across

## round three

needle 1 - k to 2 sts from end, m1, k2
needle 2 - $k 2, m 1$, $k$ to end
needle 3 - k across
round five
needle $1-k$ to 2 sts from end, m1, k2
needle $2-\mathrm{k} 3, \mathrm{~m} 1$, k to end
needle 3 - k across
round seven
needle 1 - k to 2 sts from end, m1, k2
needle 2 - $k 4, m 1, k$ to end
needle 3 - k across

## round nine

needle $1-k$ to 2 sts from end, m1, k2
needle $2-\mathrm{k} 5, \mathrm{~m} 1$, k to end
needle $3-k$ across

## round eleven

needle $1-\mathrm{k}$ to 2 sts from end, m1, k2
needle 2 - $k 6$, $m 1$, $k$ to end
needle $3-\mathrm{k}$ across

## round thirteen

needle $1-\mathrm{k}$ to 5 sts from end, place 5 sts onto holder
needle 2 - place 5 sts onto holder, $k$ to end
needle 3 - k across

- with sts remaining on needles, knit 5 rounds
- work k1, p1 ribbing for 5 or 6 rounds (depending on how long your fingers are, end the ribbing just before the bend in your knuckles)
- bind off in k1, p1


## THUMB

- move sts from holder onto 2 dpn needles, distribute evenly (or 4 sts on one, 6 sts on the other so that you know where the beg of the round is)
- with another dp, pick up 4 sts along glove edge
- k 3 rounds (or as long as you want the thumb to be)
- bind off


## FOR LEFT MITTENETTE

work same as right, but at the INCREASE ROUNDS, work as follows:

## round one

needle 1 - k to 1 st from end, $\mathrm{m} 1, \mathrm{k} 1$
needle 2 - $k 2$, $m 1$, $k$ to end
needle $3-k$ across
round two (and ALL even rounds)
needle 1 - $k$ across
needle $2-k$ across
needle 3 - k across

## round three

needle 1 - k to 2 sts from end, m1, k2
needle $2-k 2, m 1, k$ to end
needle 3 - k across

## round five

needle 1 - $k$ to 3 sts from end, m1, k3
needle 2 - $k 2, m 1$, $k$ to end
needle $3-k$ across

## round seven

needle 1 - k to 4 sts from end, m 1 , k 4
needle 2 - $k 2, m 1$, $k$ to end
needle $3-k$ across
round nine
needle 1 - k to 5 sts from end, m1, k5
needle 2 - $k 2, m 1, k$ to end
needle $3-\mathrm{k}$ across

## round eleven

needle 1 - k to 6 sts from end, m1, k6
needle $2-\mathrm{k} 2, \mathrm{~m} 1, \mathrm{k}$ to end
needle 3 - k across

## round thirteen

needle $1-\mathrm{k}$ to 5 sts from end, place 5 sts onto holder
needle 2 - place 5 sts onto holder, $k$ to end
needle 3 - k across
(continue as for RIGHT mitten)

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
